New Council Chambers and Derby Library

The Shire of Derby West/Kimberley has relocated the Council Chambers to the Derby Public Library. The lease finalised in September for the office space and old Council Chambers at 68 Clarendon Street, which provided an opportunity for the Shire to review facilities, reduce costs and use excess floor space at the Derby Library. Council resolved to relocate the Council Chambers at the Ordinary Council Meeting on 29 August 2019.

The Library is now to the left as you walk in the front door and the Council Chamber occupies the space to the right. The Library continues to provide a Children's activity area, public computers, reading and study spaces. The new Council Chamber facilitates a large space for formal Council meetings with a gallery and allows for the setup to be left in place. Due to the vicinity to the Administration building, access to a secure WiFi network is now available.

The Council is looking to source funds to update the toilets and to create a buffer between the two facilities so that in future, the Council Chambers could also be used as a public meeting space.
