Upcoming Demolition of Brooking Channel Bridge

Work is underway to construct a new two-lane bridge including a pedestrian pathway, over Brooking Channel, From Monday 10 to Thursday 13 June, the existing Brooking Channel Bridge will be demolished to enable the construction of the new bridge. This work will take place between 6am and 8pm, using specialised equipment. Nearby residents and businesses may experience some noise during this time. A viewing area will be set up for the community to safely watch the demolition take place.



A temporary crossing has been built alongside the bridge. The temporary crossing is dual-lane and sealed to ensure safe access over Brooking Channel for vehicle and pedestrians, including heavy vehicles. The temporary crossing has been constructed at a height and strength that will reduce the risk of closure in the event of unseasonable rain and flooding.

The temporary crossing will be open 24 hours a day and remain in place until the bridge opens to traffic in late 2024. Traffic management will be in place throughout this time. Please drive carefully.

Fitzroy Flood Recovery Working Group Update

The Fitzroy Valley Flood Recovery Working Group (Working Group) continues to provide ex-tropical cyclone Ellie flood recovery guidance. Our first meeting occurred in February 2023, and we have had 16 meetings since then with still a lot of work to do.

For those that are unaware, the Working Group comprises two representatives from each of the five main language groups in the Fitzroy Valley, one community and two business representatives, and the Local Recovery Coordinator.

The Working Group does not make any decisions, it does not allocate funding, and it does not speak for any of the PBCs or the other organisations and businesses within the Fitzroy Valley.



Our last meeting was on the 14th of May where we received a refurbishment and rebuild housing update from the Department of Communities, a Brooking Channel Bridge rebuild update from the Bridge Alliance, a State Digital Connectivity Network Plan update from the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development and lastly, we turned our minds to the Local Operational Recovery Plan that the Shire of Derby West Kimberley is responsible to implement as the lead flood recovery agency.

Danggu Giekie Gorge still closed after flood damage

Heavy rainfall in late-December 2022 and early-January 2023 associated with ex-Tropical Cyclone Ellie resulted in record flooding of the Fitzroy catchment, and major impacts in Danggu Geikie Gorge National Park.

The park is currently closed, recovery works are on hold for the wet season and there are plans to reopen the park in late 2024 with limited facilities.
